Transitioning to Honduran Life

As we acclimate back to Honduran life, there are many things that we are navigating and discerning. Here are some ways that you can support us in prayer:

- 1) Rocky, our dog, became seriously ill over the last month. It was heartbreaking to not be able to take care of him ourselves. While he is not out of the woods yet, we are encouraged that he is eating well now and responding to medication. He has stuck to me like glue since we have returned.
